**Maths Week:** We participated in Maths week from 18<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> of October. Each class engaged in fun and practical activities in the classroom to encourage a love of Numeracy. The children played Maths bingo games, Maths games online, worked with shopping catalogues on a budget, made 2-D and 3-d shape creations and many more enjoyable activities. 6<sup>th</sup> class also engaged in a live maths quiz through the maths week website and the feedback was excellent.

**Science Week:** We celebrated Science Week 2021 in November with classes from Junior Infants to Sixth class partaking in a wide range of activities and experiments throughout the week.

The children engaged in a variety of experiments including making lava lamps, how to make raisins dance using carbonated water and how to make slime. As a Science STEM activity the children made paper chains using a limited amount of paper and time.

We watched many live science webinars during the week including a webinar on forces from scientists in MTU. We borrowed the 'Tom Crean Box' from the museum which included a huge treasure chest full of navigational equipment and some science resources. The children had a fantastic week and we look forward to Science Week 2022!

### **Healthy Eating Week and Food Dudes:**

Our Annual Healthy Eating Week was held on October 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> 2021. The Food Dudes Programme was reintroduced to our pupils. Each child received a portion of fruit and vegetables to sample each day. The school was supplied with healthy eating DVD episodes and curriculum-based activities. An enjoyable week was had by all!

### **Cash for Clobber:**

On Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> October we held an old clothes collection.

#### **Christmas Cards:**

## **Carbon Dioxide (CO2) Monitors**

In October the Department of Education provided the school with 5 CO2 Monitors to measure the amount of CO2 in the classroom. The Board of Management provided funding for three more so that there could be one in every classroom and also in the Special Education Rooms. The monitors remind us when to freshen up the atmosphere, whether it is by opening windows and doors or by evacuating the room for a five minute break. Classrooms can be quite cold and staff and pupils frequently have to wear coats.

#### **Air Purifiers**

A few weeks ago we received a very pleasant surprise, when Berth Sheehy of Energywise Ireland arrived at the school with six Daikan Air Purifiers. To our astonishment, he announced that he was donating them free of charge to the school! He provided one for each classroom. Berth and his wife, Rosemarie, run the very successful company Energywise Ireland and have three children attending our school. They felt that by providing the Air Purifiers that it would offer another layer of protection to pupils and staff. These Air Purifiers contain Hepa Filters which trap 99.97% of particles that are 0.3 microns or larger in size. We are told that the smallest objects that the human eye can see are around 70 microns. The idea is that the Hepa Filter will trap and kill the viruses circulating in the classroom. This is of great benefit to the school community as it means that although we still have to keep the CO2 levels as low as possible, we know that if we fail to do it that the viruses in the air will be caught by the air purifier. Thanks to Energywise Ireland and to Berth and Rosemarie, we were among the first schools in the country to have a Hepa Filter in every classroom. We cannot thank them enough for their very generous gift to Sliabh a' Mhadra N.S.

## **Mask Wearing**

The Department of Education introduced a new directive recently requesting that all pupils from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> Class wear masks. Our pupils adapted very quickly and co-operated with this rule from the beginning. A little bag for your child to keep their mask in while they go out to play is necessary. A zip lock bag will suffice – although I have seen other very handy, sealable bags by some pupils. In the event of your child forgetting their mask, we have a small quantity of children's masks and we can provide the child with one of these.

## Reading

As all of you know, the importance of Reading for our children cannot be over stated. I would appeal to you to encourage your child to set aside some quiet time to read every day over the holidays. From comics to newspapers and novels to magazines, any type of reading is beneficial. Senior pupils will read themselves while younger pupils will need to engage in shared reading or have a story read to them. Books make wonderful presents at Christmas time.
